This funding was dependant on being able to demonstrate a new project and therefore the expansion of the use of the operating base into Yarm could cover this criteria. £2K was the maximum bid allowed. In addition, £1K had been received from Cleveland Police and Crime Commissioner and £250 had been received from All Saints Church which would be a regular gift. JG raised the issue of Catalyst and the potential to apply to them for funding. SB raised the possibility of having a stand on a market day in order to raise funds. SB informed the meeting Meck Tool Engineering have offered £250 for van sponsorship.	SB to progress
<b>5</b>	<b>Potential Patrols in Yarm</b>	

5.1	<p>AF spoke about the pros and cons of operating in Norton and Yarm. AF felt that Norton was focussed primarily on youth anti-social behaviour and this was not within the remit of the group.</p> <p>DR asked for comments. SB stated he had spoken with Maureen Milburn from Yarm re the use of council facilities to act as an operating base. This was approved.</p> <p>SB felt that a team of three was all that was required at Yarm.</p> <p>IB and SC stated the feedback from volunteers was that it was a good idea to expand into Yarm but not at the expense of the work being done in Stockton.</p> <p>IB raised the possibility of those in Yarm working only until 1am which may raise the number of volunteers,</p> <p>SB asked SC to look at the possibility of raising the number of volunteers from the Oakwood Centre.</p> <p>AF stated the need, will and opportunity were all present and therefore we needed to set a date to start patrolling in Yarm. SB replied the volunteers needed assurances that patrols would continue in Stockton and he would liaise with Yarm Town Council with a view to commencing patrols in September 2014.</p>	SC to report back to meeting
