Stockton Town Pastors—Project Update

Arrangements are in hand for the STP Annual General Meeting, which will be held at Stockton Baptist Tabernacle on the evening of Thursday 24th October 2013. We will have been on patrols in Stockton town centre for almost four years and will have lots to celebrate, so please make a note of the date in your diaries!

At the AGM will have the opportunity to reflect upon all that we have achieved—to date, more than 10,800 volunteer hours (not including training) amounting to an ‘added value’ of £126,400 to the community. There are also the 260 occasions when we have administered first aid—including 55 occasions when we have had to call an ambulance; the 6,200 bottles and glass items we have picked up or the hundreds of pairs of flip-flops we have dispensed to ladies in need! In total, we have personally helped more than 2,700 individuals in one way or another since that cold December night in December 2009, when we first stepped out onto the streets.

And it is all about those personal relationships, showing God’s love for others in our actions and doing all of this without judgement and regardless of circumstance!

We are continuing to build excellent relationships with the police, council, night-time economy workers and many who enjoy Stockton’s entertainment scene and this is spilling over into the broader Church through involvement with the ‘Love Stockton’ project and many other church-led initiatives across the town.

Bring friends, family and colleagues along on the 24th October 2013, and see what God is doing in Stockton!

Just look along the main roads in the town and see how many are parked up waiting for business—why not stop and talk? I am told they love what we are doing and would be pleased to get to know us more, so go on—offer them a lolly and a smile!

STP News:

Training—a Conflict management course has been arranged for 7pm on Thursday 4th July 2013 at Cleveland Police HQ, Ladgate Lane, Middlesbrough. Volunteers include those from Boro Angels, Hartlepool Town Pastors and the soon-to-start Guisborough town pastors. If you would like to come along (either a new starter or as a refresher) please let me know in advance.

Open College Network—If you would like to become involved in the nationally accredited training programme for town pastors (we are the first in the country to run this) please contact me. There are two 2 x hour courses arranged as follows:

- Thursday 18th July 7pm Stockton Baptist Tabernacle—Night-time Licensing
- Thursday 25th July 7pm Stockton Baptist Tabernacle—Crime Scenes

STP Leadership Training—I have arranged for Stockton's CCTV supervisor to deliver training in respect of the use of radios, and this will take place 7pm on Thursday 22nd August 2013 at Stockton Baptist Tabernacle. The session will also include leadership responsibilities for the role of team leader within STP. If you would like to be considered for this, please let me know.

CRB Checks—These are now called Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks. STP policy is to renew these every three years, and some volunteers will need to go through this process again within the next few months. The good news is that the initial renewal application can be done on-line. I will be contacting volunteers shortly to arrange this—there will be no cost to volunteers, and in future all checks should be 'portable' across different organisations.

The Police and Crime Commissioner, Barry Coppinger, has asked to meet with leaders from each of the 4 street angels projects in the Cleveland area, and we will be seeing him on 31st July 2013 at his offices—isn't this great news!!
